Preliminary Needs Assessment Findings:

- ➤ Children at risk of juvenile justice involvement are a grave concern. School failure and delinquency rates are high.
- Extremely high rates of children with little or no adult supervision for long periods of time due to work schedules, commutes, and other factors.
- > Strong support for school based prevention services.
- > Pronounced disparities in access to a wide range of preventative services across geographic and income strata. Limited English proficiency enhances disparities.
- Fragmented screening, identification, and referrals for children and youth with mental health issues.
- Referrals to services are inconsistent and are often dependent on school, health, or juvenile justice professionals having the right information on who to call.
- There is little mid-level support for parents and families. Families in crisis are most often routed through CPS or the juvenile justice center.
- > Stigma and discrimination may be a major factor in access to services.
