# WET Progress Report

### **Activities to Date:**

- MHSA Implementation Group Meeting—May 7—+ /- 45 participants
- Community Kick-Off Meeting—May 19—102 participants
- > 12 Stakeholder Interviews—May, June & July—12 participants
- > 2 CBO/Contractor Focus Groups/Trainings—June 10 & 16—23 participants
- > 2 BHS Manager Focus Groups, June 19 & 26–39 participants
- > 2 Consumer and Family Member Focus Groups, July 1–15 participants
- Quantitative Needs Assessment
- > Total consumer & family member participants to date: 69

#### **Preliminary Needs Assessment Findings:**

- Shortage of Psychiatrists, particularly Child Psychiatrists; Psych Techs; Nurses; Clinicians, particularly Licensed Clinicians; and Accountants.
- Shortage of many ethnic and linguistic direct service providers, particularly Latinos, African Americans, Native Americans, Southeast Asian & Chinese. All workforce needs ongoing, consistent cultural competency training.
- State pays higher wages, opening up new facilities in County. Education for some positions not offered locally.
- Clients & family members report varying experiences participating in workforce. Many want additional hours, educational opportunities, support, accountability, & recognition.
- Shortage of workers trained in dual diagnosis.
- Wellness, recovery & resiliency; cultural competency; and client & family-driven mental health are not universally embraced by all workforce. Civil service rules can limit progress.
- > Managers need additional management and supervisory training.
- Community partners need Mental Health 101, particularly law enforcement, probation, schools.
- CBOs and BHS providers outside 1212 feel disconnected. Need consistent trainings on evidence based practices and therapeutic models.
